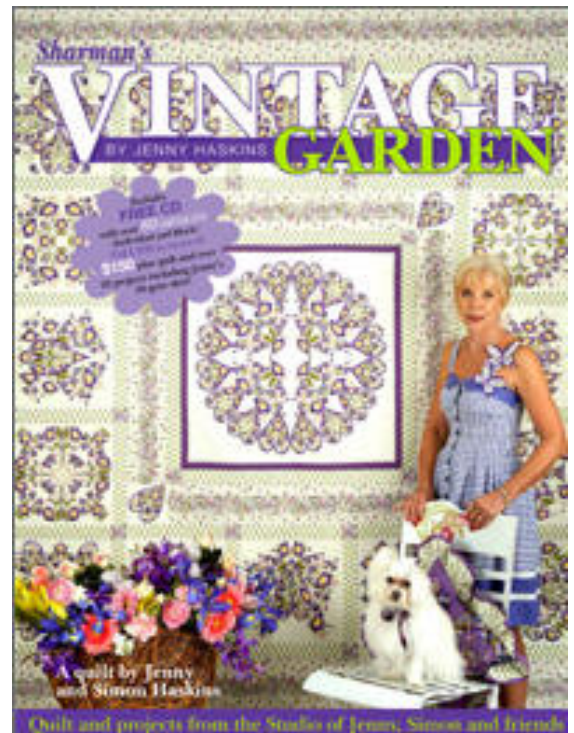

Class Supply List

BOOK AND DESIGNS:

You will need to purchase the *Sharman's Vintage Garden* book by Jenny and Simon Haskins. If you do not already own the book you can pre-order it from me for the class. The book includes the designs on a CD. I have arranged the designs we will be using so they will sew in the hoop in less hoopings so you do not have to have the designs loaded on your machine, I will have it for you on a USB stick at the class. If your machine requires another file type other than .pes, or your machine can not use a USB stick, please have a way to convert and get the design to your machine at the class.



Please look through the book and read pages 1 -21 before the class. I am not kidding!!!!!!!!!!!!

Bring the following to the first class:

***** I suggest that you pre-wash all of your fabric and press it before you cut it into the blocks *****

Your background fabric cut into twenty 18" blocks, four 8" blocks, and four 10" blocks.

A six inch strip of your focus fabric you are using for the Appliqué hearts.

Quilt Magic cut into twenty 17 ½" squares, four 7 ½ "squares, and four 9 ½" squares.

Sheer Magic cut into twenty 17 ½"squares, four 7 ½ "squares, and four 9 ½" squares.

Hoop Magic Stabilizer. Enough for about 10 hoopings.

Embroidery Threads with a selection of colors so you can do some sample stitching. See Below and in book for color suggestions.

Bobbins, and appliqué scissors.

Marking pens or chalk and a 24" ruler. 8 ½" wide if you have one.

Your embroidery machine with your large hoop. Don't forget your power cord.

A steam Iron, pressing sheet and ironing board if you have one you can bring.

Materials: (see page 16 in the book)

• FABRIC:

- 5 Yards X 45" Pale Cream background color of quilt blocks, center medallion and cornerstones.
- 4 yards X 45" lime green lattice fabric for sashing, narrow borders and appliqué.
- 6-6 yards X 45" purple, pink and lime green vertical floral fabric for center medallion, quilt borders and small sashing cornerstones.
- 2 yards X 45" purple tone-on-tone fabric for narrow center medallion borders and binding.

- 118 inches square quilt backing fabric.
 - 2 yards X 45" cream nylon organza for **optional Embroidered Decoupage appliqué hearts**.
- Three 5 Yards X 60" bolts of *Quilt Magic* light weight fusible batting. (you only need 5 yards to start with)
 - *Sheer Magic* to back fabric for embroidery and appliqué.
 - *Template Magic* printable sheet to print templates for multi-hooping of designs (this is not required if you are using .pes designs).
 - *Hoop Magic* self-adhesive tearaway stabilizer for embroidery.
 - Regular sewing Thread.
 - 40 weight Embroidery Thread for your design. These are the colors that were used to make the quilt in the book. You can use any color combination you wish. Bring a lot of thread colors to the first class as we will be stitching out a sample of block 1 and as you are stitching you may decide to change the colors around. Also, **when I stitched the quilt I only used 6 colors**; 3 (light, medium, dark) of my focus color, 2 greens, a medium and dark, and 1 gold. You can combine the colors to have less thread to work with, but you will still need to add up the spools, or make sure it is a thread you can re-order if you run out.
Purples: 3 spools Gypsy Wind, 2 spools Mulberry, 2 spools Purple Jewel, 2 spools Pansy
Pink: 1 spool Cherished Pink
Green: 1 spool Celery, 1 spool Paradise, 1 spool Band of Gold, 1 spool Penny Hill
Gold: 1 spool Medium Metallic Gold
 - Bobbins, lots of bobbins
 - Scissors, sewing needles (75/11), Pins, Rotary Cutter and matt, marking pen or chalk and ruler.
 - Small sharp scissors to cut out appliqué in the hoop.

Sharman's Vintage Garden Block Of the Month Class for 2010

For everyone interested in next year's Block of the Month Quilt, Sharman's Vintage Garden, we will be starting in February. Once again the dates will be the 4th Saturday of the month with a few exceptions for holidays. Here are the dates so you can save them on your calendars if you are interested in taking the class. Remember the class will be taught in segments, and you can sign up for any segment, or all of them for a discount.

Segment 1: Preparing the Ground for your Garden, **4 Blocks** (1, 5, 9, and 13) in **3 meetings. \$90.00**
February 27th, **March 27th** **May 1st** (skipping April for the AEC Conference in Atlanta Georgia)

Segment 2: Planting the Seeds, **6 Blocks** (2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 8) **4 meetings. \$120.00**
May 22nd, **June 26th,** **July 24th,** **August 28th**

Segment 3: Picking and Pruning your flowers, **6 Blocks** (10, 11, 12, 14, 15 and 16) **4 meetings. \$ 120.00**
September 25th, **October 23rd,** **November 20th (3rd Saturday because of Thanksgiving)**
December 18th (3rd Saturday because of Christmas)

Segment 4: Enjoying your Garden, Center Medallion 4 blocks in **1 meeting. \$40.00** You will have to finish stitching the blocks not completed in class on your own but they are easy and only 3 hooping each.

\$\$\$\$\$ Discount for signing up for all 4 segments, 12 classes: \$300.00 (that's only **\$25.00** a piece for 12, eight hour classes and a **\$70.00** savings from taking the segments individually)

\$\$\$\$\$ Discount for signing up for Segments 2 and 3, 8 classes: \$210.00 (that's only **\$26.25** a piece for 8, eight hour classes and a **\$30.00** savings from taking the segments individually)

This quilt is very versatile, and can be used to create other quilts besides the one pictured in the book. Here are some ideas, for those of you that don't want to commit to stitching the entire 20 blocks.

Each block in the quilt averages approximately 5 hours of actual stitching time. You might have to finish stitching some blocks for homework.

Mix and match, you decide how many of the blocks you want to make:

If you take segments 2 and 3, you will have 12 blocks and can make a nice quilt using sashing in-between the blocks and then add a border.

Take Segment 1 and either 2 or 3 and end up with 10 blocks and you can make the newest rage; a short bed quilt that only covers the bottom of your bed. Lots easier to make in the morning, and if you use a nice blanket/sheet, and several pillow shams, your bed looks fantastic. You could also put together the 10 blocks to make a wall hanging or throw size quilt with a pillow thrown in for good measure.

Some might just want to take the medallion class, which is really only one block, 2 sewn one way, and the other 2 mirrored, to create the center medallion for the quilt, or a wall hanging.

How about just making some pillows for your self or as gifts. Take any of the segments that will make the right number of pillows that you would like to create.

Please let me know as soon as possible if you need me to order a Sharman's Vintage Garden Book for you. \$67.99 (All designs for the quilt, plus instructions are included in the book. You must own the book to take the class. I have combined the designs so that there are less hoopings for you and will have these designs available for you in each class plus my extra special instructions with pictures showing you how to stitch out each block.)
